A burlesque smorgasbord of international high jinks—the “biography” of a hapless, twelve-fingered, would-be assassin who lurches from Sarajevo to Paris to Hollywood to Chicago to Rio, leaving high-stakes chaos in his wake. Our hero, Dimitri Borja Korozec, is born in the late 1800s to a Brazilian contortionist mother and a fanatically nationalist Serbian linotypist father. Dimitri enrolls in a training school for assassins, where he excels—except for his troubling propensity for fouling things up at the last moment. Part Carlos the Jackal, part Woody Allen’s Zelig, part Inspector Clouseau, and part Forrest Gump, Dimitri is a schlemiel of an assassin and anarchist who can’t seem to kill anyone. He does, however, cause enough mayhem to help start World War I, spread Spanish influenza to the American continent, and unintentionally trigger various other significant events of the twentieth century by slipping and falling, misreading signs, and misunderstanding instructions. Along the way Dimitri runs into—and, sometimes, nearly over—a diverse cast of bit players: Mata Hari, Al Capone, Carmen Miranda, Marie Curie, Pablo Picasso, Jean Cocteau, Irving Thalberg, George Raft, and even Aleister Crowley make their appearances. Jô Soares weaves the lives of his characters in and out of modern history, creating odd synchronicities, uncanny coincidences, and the impression that this “biography” might almost be true. True or not, it’s a laugh-out-loud romp that provides an intriguing new perspective on the history and major figures of our time, blurring the line between fact and fiction—a line which, had he encountered it on his way to an assassination, Dimitri would

most certainly have tripped over. The author offers a look at depression, drawing on his own battle with the illness and interviews with fellow sufferers, researchers, and doctors to assess the disease's complexities, causes, symptoms, and available therapies. Eu ficava olhando o rio horas e horas, sozinho, do alto do barranco, debaixo de uma goiabeira, e eu tinha um canivete que o meu padrinho um dia me dera. Foi com ele, ah! Me lembro, sim, foi com ele que, no tronco da goiabeira, escrevi a primeira palavra da minha vida. E foi o nome da minha mãe. Foi sim, foi Janira, como todo mundo falava o nome bonito dela, Dijanira. Eu nem imaginava que minha vida seria com a escrita, que escrever me garantiria o viver, que sem a palavra que escrevo não dou rumo à vida que ganhei de presente de Deus e à vida de tantos que conviveram comigo como alunos e com tantos que ainda haverão de conviver, sei lá até quando. Enquanto eu tiver vida, meu caminho será atravessado pela escrita, margeado pelo ato de desenhar meus pensamentos nas linhas de um pano, de um tronco, de um papel, de um coração, de uma alma – a sua, quem sabe. Este é um livro de crônicas linguístico-literárias de um professor apaixonado pelo ensino. Não são crônicas à moda de um Rubem Braga nem de um Otto Lara Resende,

mas de um professor que não consegue sair da sala de aula. E tudo o que ele fala, conversa e escreve tem o tom de uma aula, fundamentada nas reflexões filosóficas de Mikhail Bakhtin e seu círculo de estudos sobre a linguagem. Os textos são datados e foram publicados no período de 2011 a 2015, cada um deles em edição semanal de O Jornal de Batatais, da Estância Turística de Batatais, cidade em que vivo há 38 anos. Os assuntos que inspiram meus textos são a gramática, a leitura, a literatura, a escrita, a sala de aula, a minha vida, enfim. Viver é o que há de melhor.
