When we read old family letters or hear stories about our great-grandparents, they hold our attention in a particular way. Events from long before we were born are about us: they tell us something important about who we are. Commonly we read the Bible as a historical text, making it a source of facts or doctrines: useful information, but perhaps not very personal. Yet the narratives in early chapters of the Bible need to be understood not as ancient history, but as part of the story of our family. Again and again, for example, the people of Israel of later generations were reminded, "Remember that you were slaves in Egypt"--they must understand that the story of the*

deliverance is not distant history, but their own reality. From the Mists of Eden retells eleven key stories, from Genesis through Joshua, as family stories: Aunt Hagar and Aunt Sarai, Uncle Joshua, and Uncle Red and Uncle Jacob and Uncle Joe. From the exotic jungles of the Congo to New York's Fifth Avenue, this story skillfully sweeps the reader along in a fast-moving adventure of suspense, passion, and romance. A strong theme of faith and trust in the perfection of the universe is woven throughout the book, intertwined with feats of human courage, while demonstrating the magic of inner guidance and vision. Yehudit Katzir, Etgar Keret, Amos Oz, Yaakov Shabtai, Benjamin Tammuz, and A. B. Yehoshua are among the writers who engage with depictions of suicide in a critical and rhetorical

process that reconsiders myths at the heart of the Zionist project. In Israeli literature, suicide is linked to a society's compulsion to create impossible ideals that leave its populace disappointed and deluded. Yet, as Rachel S. Harris shows, even at their harshest these writers also acknowledge the idealism that helped build Israel as a modern nation-state. He immigrated with his mother and sister to the newly established state of Israel in 1953, where he would eventually serve in the Elite Paratrooper unit in the Israel Defense Forces. Sergies adventures would eventually take him to the United States, where he met a woman born in the same Manchurian hospital he was in who would change his life. This autobiography offers not only the tale of one mans life and rich, varied cultural heritage, but also a

unique perspective on historical events of his many lands that he witnessed firsthand. In the year 2171, in the aftermath of a great war between the Kingdom of East and the Republic of West, a dark nuclear winter devastates the planet, blotting out the sun and stars.
